
SPEED. POWER. EFFICIENCY.


Three words that describe Auburns, Cords and Duesenbergs, but when you see or drive one with a supercharged engine, they take on a whole new meaning. The Auburn Automobile Company and Duesenberg, Inc. led the way when it came to supercharging their automobiles. It was seen as a means to add speed, power and efficiency to automobiles without having to design a larger, heavier engine and automobile.

What is a supercharger and what does it do? In short, a supercharger is an air compressor that adds more air pressure into the cylinders of an engine through the means of a fast spinning impeller. The greater the air and fuel mixture that is compressed, the higher the output of power. It allows a more efficient combustion of the fuel mixture by evenly distributing the mixture throughout the engine. With Auburn, Cord and Duesenberg automobiles, the supercharger is mechanically driven and the impeller spins at speeds up to six-times the engine speed. If the engine is rotating at 2,000 rotations per minute (rpm), the impeller is spinning at 12,000 rpm!

Duesenberg, Inc. saw the advantages of superchargers and applied it to its own engines. It was the first to add them to its engines for use in racing. In 1932, after the introduction of the Model J in 1929, Duesenberg added a centrifugal supercharger to its engine as an option for an additional \$1,000. Already a powerful straight-eight-cylinder engine at 265 horsepower, it boosted the output to a whopping 320 horsepower, an increase in power of 20%. Duesenbergs that were fitted with the supercharger carried the designation "SJ." The exhaust manifold had to be designed differently to accommodate the supercharger unit. A few designs were made, but the most common was four exhaust pipes covered in attractive flex stainless steel that exited the passenger side of the engine compartment. Zero to 60 mph was achieved in about eight







seconds, depending upon which body style was chosen. Only 36 Duesenbergs were supercharged by the factory.

Supercharged eight-cylinder engines were added to the line of Auburn automobiles as an option in 1935 and 1936. They were available for all body styles. Naturally aspirated, the 1935 and 1936 Auburn eight-cylinder Lycoming engines produced 115 horsepower. With the centrifugal Schwitzer-Cummins supercharger, the engine output was rated at 150, an increase in power of 30%. Zero to 60 mph was achieved in about 15 seconds. On average, a supercharged car cost an additional \$500-700, depending on the body style. Four flexible stainless steel exhaust pipes that exited the driver's side of the hood indicated a supercharged engine. Auburn pushed its supercharged line heavily in marketing and in stock car racing. One such Auburn speedster, driven by Ab Jenkins, set over 70 stock car speed records in 1935, sanctioned through the American Automobile Association (AAA). The Auburn White Caravan was a 150-stop countrywide promotional tour whose purpose was to push sales of the supercharged Auburns. In total, 774 Auburns were produced with a supercharged engine by the time production stopped in early 1936.

The Auburn Automobile Company offered the option of supercharged engines to the Cord automobile in 1937 for an additional \$415. They were available for all body styles and for the custom line. Its V-8 engine produced 125 horsepower, but power charts indicated that the engine equipped with a centrifugal Schwitzer-Cummins supercharger



produced up to 190 horsepower. However, the company rated the engine at 170 horsepower. Zero to 60 mph was achieved in 13 seconds. Two stainless steel exhaust pipes exiting on each side of the hood indicated a supercharged engine. Just like with the Auburn line, supercharged Cords were used in stock car racing, time trials and more. Two supercharged Cords competed in the Stevens Challenge, a 24-hour endurance race held at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway in 1937. Driven by Ab Jenkins, the Cord broke the record by covering 1,909 miles in 24 hours for an average of 79.5 mph – a record that stood until 1954. Despite the racing accolades, the end was near for the Cord and the Auburn Automobile Company, which closed in August of 1937. In total, of the 2,995 Cord 810 and 812s produced, just 688 supercharged Cords were built by the factory.

Overall, supercharging attributed to a small portion of the Auburn, Cord and Duesenberg history. At the time it was seen as a means to reinvigorate the brands with an infusion of power and technology in already advanced automobiles. However, it ended up as a last gasp by the two companies to entice new consumers and reverse the decline in sales. Today, supercharged Auburns, Cords and Duesenbergs represent the very best of the Auburn Automobile Company and Duesenberg, Inc. They are among the most coveted automobiles produced by the companies. People continue to be allured and inspired by the speed, power and efficiency of these fine automobiles.

It's apparent that Bickford is passionate about continuing to uphold the innovation and growth of an employeecentric company. As he notes, "Our employees drive the company."



2023 GRAND MARSHAL -

CORKY COKER



Joseph "Corky" Coker says it's almost as if he was born to be a part of the collector car hobby and the specialty equipment market. Corky's father Harold started Coker Tire in 1958 and named his son after the Sunday newspaper comic strip "Gasoline Alley" – Corky thinks he was destined to be into all things gasoline, cars and restoration. Despite being raised around the family tire business and collector cars, Corky grew up raising livestock on the family's farm. He originally thought he wanted to become a veterinarian, but guickly realized he wasn't quite the student it took to be successful in veterinary school.

Corky's dad asked him to come back home to take over the vintage tire portion of the family's tire business. He soon discovered that he really loved the people and the cars in the collector car world. "I began to realize that the people buying vintage and hot rod tires were really happy spending money with us because I helped them get to play with their toys," he says. "I soon got my head (and my whole heart) into it and started developing ideas and goals of my own." Over the years, Corky put those ideas into practice and began adding





product lines and other businesses. He acquired vintage tire molds from all over the world, contracting with quality tire manufacturers to produce the company's product line. He chased old original tire molds and negotiated licensing agreements with companies like BFGoodrich, Firestone, Michelin and U.S. Royal Tires, and he developed many new brands also owned by Coker Tire. Coker Tire grew to be the largest supplier of vintage and collector vehicle tires in the world, averaging shipping two tractor trailers full of tires per day to individuals all over the country and to its distributors in 50 countries outside the U.S.

Corky's personal auto collection includes more than 150 collector cars and 100 antique motorcycles, and he takes part annually in The Great Race – a timed speed distance endurance car event that runs from coast to coast. In 1998, Coker acquired Honest Charley, America's first mail-order speed shop founded in 1948 by Honest Charley Card himself. Honest Charley celebrates its 75th anniversary this year in 2023.

As he worked to grow his businesses, Corky also devoted much of his time building the whole industry through his efforts with SEMA (Specialty Equipment Market Association). He was one of the founders of the Automotive Restoration Market Organization, which named Coker Tire its Manufacturer of the Year in 1997 and inducted Corky into the ARMO Hall of Fame the following year. He served numerous terms on the SEMA board of directors and became the association's chairman in 2003. Corky was inducted into the SEMA Hall of Fame in 2008.

Though faith and charity are hallmarks of his character, Corky's humanitarian and community involvements are less well-known. He is a recipient of the Silver Beaver Award from the Boy Scouts of America and has been very active promoting Chattanooga, Tennessee for years. He was selected as Chattanooga's Businessman of the Year in 1995 and as Tennessee's Business-Person of the Year by the Small Business Administration in 1996. He recently joined the board of Bible In The Schools in Chattanooga. He has made numerous shortterm mission trips to places like the Caribbean Christian Center for the Deaf in Jamaica and the Chosen Children Ministries, a Christ-centered ministry for orphanages with a focus in Nicaragua.

"I learned that it's always the right thing to do the right thing," he says. "I became a Christian in my early 20s, but have learned that I need to be in God's word daily because His word is real truth."

Faith and family are extremely important in Corky's life, both personally and in business. As major influences guiding him, he points to his mother Lill Coker, his father Harold Coker and his grandfather Pop Coker, but most importantly daily time in God's word. He has been married to his wife, Theresa Mondl Coker for 45 years. His two children, Casey and Cameron, both worked in the Coker family businesses.

The Great Race is a nine-day time rally race for vintage vehicles. Unlike a typical race, it involves following highly specific instructions that usually take racers down back roads. The goal of the Great Race is not to finish first, but rather to follow instructions precisely enough so that the participants cross each checkpoint at the exact time determined by the Great Race staff. It's not as easy as it sounds. Race teams have to factor in the time lost by stopping, turning, etc. They must try to figure out that amount of time and then make it up during the drive. Furthermore, the teams do not know where the checkpoints are ahead of time, nor do they know what their time should be when crossing it. Each day, the race takes teams to



a lunch stop and a dinner stop. Both stops are set up similarly to Auburn's Third Thursday Cruise-Ins. The race cars are parked cruise-in style while the racers eat lunch or dinner. During this time, the public can look at the race cars and interact with the racers. The Auburn youth teams are able



DELIVERING ON A PROMISE

Alex Haggard admits that when he shifted career gears, he had no idea what the next week might hold.

The son of a single mother who worked long hours just to feed her three children, Haggard grew up with the firm conviction that success meant making lots of money. "Eventually, I did," he says.

The North Side High School graduate worked for a decade in finance for various automotive groups. The long hours weren't too bad, until he married and had four daughters. Eventually, the big house and new cars started to pale compared to the time he was missing with his family. It was then Haggard realized, "I was no longer enjoying my success."

He left his job and started from the ground up on a new career path. "A friend of mine became an agent for Echo Global Logistics and was working out of the back of a U-Haul building in Westfield, Indiana. He invited me, along with another friend, to join the venture and we started MAD Logistics," Haggard says. The three friends set about learning the ins and outs of the logistics business. "For months, we drove around behind businesses counting the dock doors, figuring out their shipping needs and selling our services."

Haggard was so committed to his new career that he and his wife, Allison, sold their 6,000 square foot home and their luxury cars. Along with their daughters, four dogs and whatever furniture would fit, they moved into an "itty-bitty house and drove two beater cars."

Eventually, Haggard decided to branch out on his own and FAK Logistics was born in 2012. His professional experience and relationships in northeast Indiana helped to scale the business.

Today, FAK Logistics has reached \$60 million a year in revenue and has 20 employees running its day-to-day operations.

Haggard's experiences have taught him valuable business lessons.

"I don't currently own any trucks, but I did at one point," he says. "It taught me how brokers should do business with carriers and how important that relationship is."

His company oversees the entire process from booking the shipment to delivery, tracking it all with state-ofthe-art applications. "We never give



freight back to a customer," Haggard adds. "We always deliver on our promise, no matter the cost to us."

The businesses' success has given him the means to help nonprofits and other start-up businesses in the area. He is a partner of two restaurants and bars, two tree companies, two car lots and a real estate investment company. "I love to invest in people and their ideas," he says.

Haggard credits his wife for sticking with him since day one. The days of the "itty-bitty house" are over for the family. They now live in a historic Forest Park Boulevard dream home that Haggard always told his high school friends he would someday own. He also has time to spend with his family and work on his growing classic car collection.

WHEN AND HOW DID YOUR INTEREST IN CARS BEGIN?

My mom tells me about family Christmas parties we attended when I was young. My aunt played the piano for everyone and I would always ask why she kept pushing on the brake, which was of course the pedal. I've liked cars for as long as I can remember. I would build models as a young boy and had a slot-car race track, and I've always liked to take things apart and am mechanically inclined. I got my first car at 19-yearsold and it was a used corvette. I enjoy all kinds of cars now, not just classics.

HOW DID YOU DISCOVER THE SUPERCHARGED CAR? WHAT ABOUT THIS CAR IS MOST SPECIAL TO YOU?

This particular car was used in the TV show "Boston Blackie" in 1951. At the time, it was owned by Asa Clark, the film editor of the show. It was then bought by Millard Wilkerson of California in 1952, who sold it to Don Real of Ohio in 1953. Real sold it to Vern Cunningham of Ontario in 1957 and in 2002 I purchased it from Cunningham. I was able to buy the car with the help of my good friend Randy Emma from California. So far, my wife and I have put 65,000 pleasurable miles on it. Of all the cars I own, the Speedster garners the most attention. People from all walks of life comment on it – from little children to grandmothers. They all recognize the beautiful lines of the Auburn Speedsters. When people ask what it is, few have heard of an Auburn. The Speedster has opened many doors for us over the years. There was a time when we were at



a gas station and needed to use the restroom, but were told they didn't have a public bathroom. The employee then asked if that was my black car at the pump. When I said "yes," she told me I could use the employee bathroom. That was the first time the Speedster opened a bathroom door for me!

We have driven the car on several ACD Club Tours, including many Hoosier Tours by the ACD Festival. We've even taken it on a 9,600 mile, seven-week trip from Hudsonville, Michigan to Florida, to California and then back to Hudsonville. I hope my wife and I can put many more wonderful miles on Boston Blackie.

WHAT DO YOU MOST LOOK FORWARD TO ABOUT THE ACD

FESTIVAL? The annual ACD Festival Hoosier Tour. The tour arrives on the Thursday before Labor Day weekend, but we leave on Monday along with about 50 other cars. We stay in a hotel a couple nights and really enjoy each others company. We love cars and have been members of the ACD Club for over 25 years. We initially joined for the cars, but now it's for the cars and our friends we've made along the way – they're our people. We talk about cars together, but it's more than that. Everyone is so kind.



WHEN AND HOW DID YOUR INTEREST IN CARS

BEGIN? I grew up as an automobile enthusiast with four generations of my family belonging to the ACD Club. I began working on cars and attending shows at a young age and continue to promote our automotive history by researching, maintaining and displaying the different cars. While we have other

makes of automobiles, the 1937 Supercharged Cord Cabriolet along with the ACD Club are what we are most involved with.

HOW DID YOU DISCOVER THE SUPERCHARGED CAR? WHAT ABOUT THIS CAR IS MOST SPECIAL TO YOU?

Our Cord Cabriolet was purchased new in New Mexico, and in the 1940s the original owner sold the car to a mechanic in northwest Oklahoma. In 1964, my uncle George Waken purchased the car and we began our first restoration. The car was painted bronze with a tan top and leopard-skin interior! While our first renovation was to make the car operational, our ultimate goal was a complete restoration. Throughout the early 1970s, we completely disassembled the car and restored it to its original condition. In 1975, our Cord appeared at its first

Auburn Labor Day event without the front sheet metal or front fenders. The full display of a working Supercharged Lycoming V-8 engine, frontwheel drive

and shifting system was a hit. The Cabriolet won the Tom Mix Award for Best Cord at the ACD West Coast Meet in 1976 and 1977, and the Gordon Buehrig Award for Best Cord at the 1980 Auburn Reunion. Since then, the car has attended over 40 Auburn Reunions and has been driven from Oklahoma to Auburn 30 times – all as we continue to maintain the car in its original show condition.

WHAT DO YOU MOST LOOK FORWARD TO ABOUT THE ACD FESTIVAL? Uncle George started attending the Auburn



show in the 1960s and over the next 60 years we grew to four generations attending the event. Through time we have learned from the people that originally bought and maintained the cars, watched our ACD family grow and have seen the ACDA Museum turn into one of the premier automotive museums in the nation. The Auburn Reunion is a family event, not just for the Waken family, but for all our ACD family. The cars are a special bond for all of us, but the people are the reason that we keep coming back each year.



WHEN AND HOW DID YOUR INTEREST IN CARS BEGIN?

When I was young, I was always fascinated with mechanical things. My father let me buy a 1959 Buick station wagon before I was able to drive. I started taking it apart and, soon after, my dad said it would never get put back together. It was hauled to the recycler. In our neighborhood there was a family that was into highperformance cars. They had a couple of 1950s Corvettes and a 1964 AC Cobra. I was able to ride in them a couple times and then became their young apprentice. My first job was to sand down a 1956 Corvette and paint it with spray cans.

HOW DID YOU DISCOVER THE SUPERCHARGED CAR? WHAT ABOUT THIS CAR IS MOST SPECIAL TO YOU?

We've attended the ACD Festival for many years. My sister-inlaw lived on Main Street and always hosted a family with a 1932 Auburn V-12. We enjoyed riding in it and vowed we would someday have an ACD car.

In 1999, my wife Kathy and I started our search. I had decided upon an 810-812 Cord sedan. After checking out a project car in Marion, I talked to a number of ACD members who were gathered at the museum parking lot on Labor Day and asked if anyone would be willing to travel to Marion to check out my possible purchase. A club member named Ray Cloud who owned a 1932 Auburn Speedster mentioned he had a Cord he might sell. After an hour of grilling me on my intentions for the Cord, he decided I was fit for the job. It was a supercharged custom Beverly. When I asked why this would be a better choice than the Marion car, I was told a supercharged long wheelbase was better. We made a deal right then and there.

I have enjoyed participating

in 20 Hoosier Tours with my sons and grandchildren in this car. I also enjoy displaying it on 9th Street and encouraging people to sit in it for photos – especially the younger kids.

WHAT DO YOU MOST LOOK FORWARD TO ABOUT THE

ACD FESTIVAL? I look forward to the full week of activities, especially because it brings our family and friends together. Relatives and friends come from as far as Florida and California to enjoy the cars and festivities. Being an ACD Club member, I have enjoyed the lasting friendship of fellow members. I've also had the satisfaction of serving on its board of directors for nine years, and have influenced others to embrace the old car hobby.

How does a 17-year-old, six-foot tall, soccer-playing entrepreneur get started rebuilding carburetors with her best friends? That's what intrigued me as I read Riley Schlick-Trask's story in a recent issue of Hagerty Driver Club magazine. The owner of Riley's Rebuilds has an interesting and inspiring story to tell. She recalls her recent appearance on the "All-Girls Garage" TV show on MotorTrend network as one of her top bucket-list experiences so far, describing it as, "A total dream come true to be with the hosts, Bogi and Faye, and show them how to setup and tune a carb." Schlick-Trask is active on social media with a strong and growing Facebook following, and even has her own YouTube channel stocked full of instructional videos for the auto-repair challenged.

Tell us a little about yourself and how you got into rebuilds.

I am a 17-year-old high school senior getting ready for college. I play competitive soccer as a goalkeeper and will soon be playing for Connecticut College – go Camels! I surf, skate and work on old cars. When I was 13, I wanted to buy my first car so I could work on it with my dad. I thought he would buy it for me. I started asking him about it and he made me a deal: He would match any money I made and we would put it toward my first car. I asked him what I could do to make money. He had a lot of old car parts in the garage from past projects, so he let me clean them up, polish the chrome parts and sell them on eBay. I eventually found a carburetor and asked how much I would make if it sold. He estimated around \$200-300 and I said, "Let's do it!"

My dad taught me to rebuild the carburetors he had on hand and thev sold fast. I then started searching on Facebook Marketplace and Craigslist to purchase others. We would drive around Florida on the weekends and buy them all. I was playing travel soccer at the time, so we drove A LOT. During the week after school, practice and homework, I would rebuild them. In about eight months I made enough money to buy my first car – a really ugly light blue 1995 YJ Jeep. I knew it was going to be a work in progress, so I kept rebuilding carbs to pay for parts and paint. Now it's a screenaccurate Jurassic Park Jeep with a sound board that roars and plays the theme music from the movie.

About a year ago, a post I made asking for carburetor parts went viral. I had way more work than I could handle. I was able to hire three of my best friends to help. Now we girls are building carburetors as our after-school job. We make all the money we need for gas, our personal projects, insurance and fun.

What are some of the coolest cars for which you've rebuilt the carburetor?

I've done some carbs for really cool cars like a yellow 1972 Pantera, Corvettes, GTOs, Chevelles and a million hot rods – and also for my personal 1966 Ford Fairlane. I get a charge when customers send me pictures of their project cars running. I like to think each carb that goes out is getting another cool old car on the road so people can see it, and so the owner can have some fun.

Do you have a favorite car?

I like sleepers; ratty-looking and dirty on the outside, but really fast and surprising on the inside. My 1966 Fairlane is like that.

What are your future goals?

Right now I'm figuring out how to bring this job with me to college. My soccer coach has given me the okay to bring my equipment with me and set it up in the engineering department. I may be able to hire some of the girls on the team to help me keep it going. I also tune carbs on clients' cars, so I'm looking for some classic car consignment shops in Connecticut to let me come and tune for them.

ACD FESTIVAL OFFICIAL MERCHANDISE

PARKING

Overnight parking is restricted at the ACDA Museum and Plaza.
